Read the announcement carefully; the application processing fee will NOT be refunded to disapproved applicants.

VACANCY: The eligible list established as a result of this examination will be used, when appropriate, to fill vacancies as they occur in all units under the jurisdiction of the Dutchess County Department of Human Resources.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Candidates must meet the following requirements on or before November 9, 2024:

EITHER:	(A)	Bachelor's degree, which included course work or experience in using word processing and desktop publishing software;
OR:	(B)	Associate's degree and one year of full-time paid work experience in social work, community services, human services,
		communications, planning or a closely related field. Work experience must have included a significant amount of time
		preparing written communications using word processing and desktop publishing software;
OR:	(C)	Graduation from high school or possession of a high school equivalency diploma and three years of full-time paid work experience in social work, community services, human services, communications, planning or a closely related field. Work experience must have included a significant amount of time preparing written communications using word processing and desktop publishing software.
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Candidates qualifying under (A) must submit written statement listing either course(s) in word processing and desktop publishing software or describing experience using such software. Candidates qualifying under (B) or (C) must describe work experience in detail, including the type and extent of written communications produced and the software packages utilized.

Unless otherwise specified, part-time experience will be pro-rated towards meeting the full-time experience requirements. 2

SPECIAL REQUIREMENT: Possession of a valid New York State driver license.

<u>DUTIES</u>: This position is responsible for promoting the agency's programs to the general public, potential consumers and related agencies as well as assisting in the recruitment, assignment, monitoring and recognition of program volunteers. The employee also assists in the development and execution of special programs carried out by the department. The incumbent will be actively involved in the community through his or her work to promote the department's programs and volunteer participation. Work is performed in accordance with established policies and procedures under the general supervision of the Director, Office for the Aging. Leeway is allowed in carrying out work assignments. **EXAMPLES OF WORK (Illustrative Only)**: Maintains ongoing communications with department staff and community groups to fulfill the department's mission and goals through the development of promotional activities and the overall management of volunteers; prepares or supervises the preparation and distribution of reports, press releases and other materials; engages in various public relations activities such as writing news releases and other media materials to publicize department programs and special events and volunteer opportunities; produces and edits quarterly senior citizen newsletter and writes weekly senior news column published in several local newspapers; maintains records and provides reports on volunteer services as required by funding sources and to serve as guides for future planning; identifies and evaluates agency needs which can best be served by volunteers including recruitment for Advisory Board members; plans and manages volunteer recognition activities; assists in the management of the Senior Discount Card Program; evaluates developments in the Office for the Aging for potential public relations value and develops and maintains working relationships with various media groups in the region; may conduct training programs for staff and volunteer workers; may conduct or attend conferences, workshops and seminars concerned with problems facing the aging or others in the long term care system; prepares communication materials and correspondence for the Director.

SUBJECT OF EXAMINATION: A test designed to evaluate knowledge, skills and/or abilities in the following areas:

Educating and interacting with the public

These questions test for knowledge of techniques used to interact effectively with individuals and/or community groups, to educate or inform them about topics of concern, to publicize or clarify agency programs or policies, to negotiate conflicts or resolve complaints, and to represent one's agency or program in a manner in keeping with good public relations practices. Questions may also cover interacting with others in cooperative efforts of public outreach or service.

Grammar, usage, punctuation, and editing

These questions test for the ability to generate, prepare, and edit written documents. Some questions test for a knowledge of grammar, usage, punctuation, and sentence structure. Others test for the ability to edit sentences to produce correct, clear, concise copy.

Preparing public information materials

These questions test for the ability to prepare basic informational materials electronically and in print, for the public and the media, including such products as correspondence, brochures, and news releases. Questions may cover such topics as selecting content to effectively communicate with the intended audience, making decisions regarding page readability of text, and using graphics, photographs, headlines, or captions to enhance a message.

Preparing written material

These questions test for the ability to present information clearly and accurately, and to organize paragraphs logically and comprehensibly. For some questions, you will be given information in two or three sentences followed by four restatements of the information. You must then choose the best version. For other questions, you will be given paragraphs with their sentences out of order. You must then choose, from four suggestions, the best order for the sentences.

Promoting and publicizing a program

These questions test for knowledge of the principles and practices related to promoting and publicizing a program or service in order to attract customers, clients, or participants. Questions may cover such topics as researching and setting promotion objectives, appealing to various target audiences, and producing and distributing informational materials.

Test guide:

The New York State Department of Civil Service has not prepared a test guide for this examination. However, candidates may find information in the publication 'General Guide to Written Tests' helpful in preparing for this test. When the examination is prepared and rated by the New York State Department of Civil Service in accordance with Section 23.2 of the Civil Service Law, the administration of this examination, including rating and review, is governed by the provisions of the New York State Civil Service Rules and Regulations.

<u>RETURNED CHECK FEE</u>: A \$20.00 fee will be required for all returned checks. Failure to submit the returned check fee will disqualify you from the exam in which you participated.

<u>FINGERPRINTING</u>: An appointing authority may require a fingerprint supported background investigation before appointment. The candidate may be responsible for paying any associated fees with this service.

<u>MULTIPLE EXAMINATIONS</u>: If you are applying for civil service examinations offered by other government jurisdictions (New York State, another county, city, etc.) that are being held on the same date as this examination, you must make arrangements to take all examinations at one test site. Note: If you have applied for both New York State and Dutchess County examinations, you must take all examinations at the State site. **You are required to complete and return a <u>Cross-Filer Form</u>, available on the Dutchess County website <u>www.dutchessny.gov</u>, to the Dutchess County Department of Human Resources no less than two (2) weeks prior to the examination date**. Failure to provide such information within this time frame may result in disqualification from one or more examinations.

<u>ALTERNATE TEST DATES</u> may be arranged upon review of documented circumstances in accordance with established policy. Such arrangements must be made prior to the exam except for emergency situations or active military service.

<u>RELIGIOUS ACCOMMODATION</u>: – If you cannot take the test on the announced test date (most written exams held on Saturdays) due to a conflict with a religious observance or practice, indicate this on your application. You will be granted an alternate test date, usually during the following week.

<u>SPECIAL ACCOMMODATION</u>: If you require an accommodation or special assistance in taking an exam, indicate this on your application. Documentation will be required.

<u>COLLEGE CREDITS AND/OR DEGREE</u>: Your degree or college credit must have been awarded by a college or university accredited by a regional, national, or specialized agency recognized as an accrediting agency by the U.S. Department of Education/U.S. Secretary of Education. If your degree was awarded by an educational institution outside the United States and its territories, you must provide independent verification of equivalency. A list of acceptable companies who provide this service can be found on the internet at http://www.cs.ny.gov/jobseeker/degrees.cfm. You must pay the required evaluation fee.

<u>VETERANS</u>: Military personnel who are either in the service at time of examination or who have already been discharged may apply for disabled or non-disabled veterans' credits if they meet established criteria. Candidates who are interested in these additional credits should request an application and information sheet from the Dutchess County Department of Human Resources. Veterans' application forms will also be available on the website and upon request at the examination center. The completed forms and DD-214 (Member 4 Copy) must be received in the office as soon as possible after the examination date or before the eligible list for this examination is established.

<u>CALCULATORS</u>: Unless otherwise notified, candidates are permitted to use quiet, hand-held, solar or battery powered calculators. Devices with typewriter keyboards, spell checkers, personal digital assistants, address books, language translators, dictionaries or any similar devices are prohibited.

<u>ADMISSION TO EXAMINATION</u>: Do not interpret a notice to appear for, or actual participation in the examination to mean that you have been found to meet fully the announced requirements.

Depending on the time available before an examination, *applicants may be admitted to the examination on the basis of statements made on the application or conditionally, without prior review of the application. Such statements may not be reviewed and/or verified until after the examination is held.* At that time, those candidates not meeting the requirements are disqualified. Candidates who are subsequently disqualified after taking the test will NOT be notified of their score.

If you do not receive a notice <u>three days prior</u> to the date of examination informing you whether or not you are to be admitted to the examination, call the Dutchess County Department of Human Resources immediately at 845-486-2169.

<u>CHANGE OF ADDRESS</u>: Notify this office immediately of any change of address. The appropriate change of address form is available on the website, in the Dutchess County Department of Human Resources, and will be available at the examination center.

<u>RESIDENCE PREFERENCE</u>: Pursuant to Section 23.4a of Civil Service Law, preference in appointment from open-competitive lists may be given to candidates who have been residents in a locality or school district in which appointment is to be made for at least 30 days prior to certification of the eligible list. For appointment in some jurisdictions you may be required to become a resident thereof in accordance with law or resolution.

<u>NOTE</u>: In conformance with section 85-a of the Civil Service Law, children of firefighters and police officers killed in the line of duty shall be entitled to receive an additional ten points in a competitive examination for original appointment in the same municipality in which his or her parent has served. If you are qualified to participate in this examination and are a child of a firefighter or police officer killed in the line of duty in this municipality, please inform this office of this matter when you submit your application for examination. A candidate claiming such credit has a minimum of two months from the application deadline to provide the necessary documentation to verify additional credit eligibility. However, no credit may be added after the eligible list has been established.
